Voice of Calvary Ministries (VOCM) has been Rebuilding Lives and Communities since 1975. It was 1974 when Rev. and Mrs. Perkins moved to Jackson, leaving the work in Mendenhall in the good hands of Dolphus Weary and Artis Fletcher. Several of the young people from Mendenhall were enrolled in what was then Jackson College in the west Jackson neighborhood where the Perkins family settled and they wanted to establish a base of support for them.

Along with the Perkins family came H and Terry Spees, their children and Herbert Jones. Also, some volunteers came to help set up the support base for Rev. Perkins' travel and teaching ministry all across the country. 1655 St. Charles became the hub of activity and was called The Center for Continuous Christian Community or the 4 C's Center.

During these early years the mission of VOCM was discussed, debated and determined to be what it continues to be today: <u>to help individuals and families reach their full potential in Christ spiritually, physically, economically and socially.</u> Luke 4:16-21 became the bedrock scripture on which to base the works of ministry that were built up to reach the neighborhood with hope and acts of service.

The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to set the oppressed free, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor. Luke 4: 18,19

The reconciliation, friendship and peer relationships demonstrated at VOCM between the mostly black and white, young and old, poor and not so poor staff members and church members at Voice of Calvary Fellowship was and is unique in our society. It became a witness to the Jackson community and people across the United States. Volunteers came from church groups, colleges and seminaries to experience the Christian love and gain understanding of the call to Christian Community Development that was and still is happening in west Jackson. The work isn't always easy but it is rewarding. Staff member Barbara Thornton often says, "I love my job!"

Phil came to Jackson in 1975 and I came in 1976. We are still here in Mississippi because we found Jesus working through His people on a daily basis to help those in need and bridge the racial divide so prevalent in our culture. Dr. John Perkins at 94 years old and Mrs. Vera Mae Perkins at 91 years old still live in the community and we are able to see and talk to them on a regular basis. Their love for community development is still strong. We are proud to say Voice of Calvary Ministries is going strong too and continues to bring good news to the poor.

What does it mean to bring good news? There is help and hope available. You don't have to remain in poverty. As current VOCM President Margaret Johnson says, "Your zip code shouldn't limit your possibilities." She continues the legacy of leading and guiding the staff and everyone they serve in a life dedicated to making a difference.
